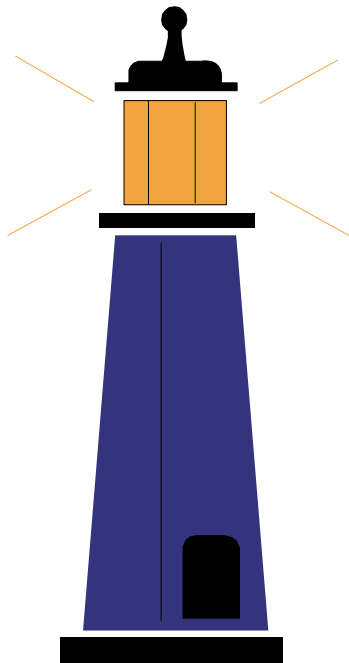

HOW TO GET YOUR ID OR DRIVER'S LICENSE IN GA.

PART A:

If you have had a GA ID or GA Driver's License before:

The GA. Dept of Public Safety began fingerprinting in September 1996 so if you have gotten your ID or DL since then you have been fingerprinted. If you have been fingerprinted, you do not need to prove who you are. You do not need your birth certificate, social security card, or any other document. All you need is proof of where you live. See **PART C** for information on proof of residence. If you were not fingerprinted the last time you got a GA. ID or DL, you must present one item from list 1 or two items from list 2 to show proof of who you are.

VOTER REGISTRATION

For Fulton County ONLY

Can homeless people vote?

Yes. Any one who lives in Fulton County and who at the time of registration is not on probation for a felony is eligible to vote.

Why register to vote?

1. To exercise your right as a citizen to vote for issues and candidates of your choice.
2. Your voter registration card serves as a form of ID, and along with your social security card, it is sufficient to get your ID card or driver's license renewed at the GA Dept. of Public Safety. (If you have never had an ID card or driver's license in Ga., you must have your birth certificate; the voter registration card will not help you get your ID)

Most of the time you should receive your voter registration card within 7 business days after you apply. However, around election time, it may take longer. When you register, you should ask how long it would take for you to receive your card.

Street Home: Monday – Friday 8:30am-5:00pm

Who can be in St. Home?

Anyone who is homeless or staying in shelters, transitional or temporary housing. Anyone who seeks alcohol and/or drug treatment. All participants must be HIV positive.

Who is Involved

The St. Home program is a collaborative effort between Mercy Mobile Health Care, AID Atlanta, and Project Open Hand.

Goals

It is anticipated that clients who progress through the program will be in a better position to obtain housing, peer support, work toward eliminating substance abuse, and promote lifestyle changes that minimize health risks, and improve quality of life.

TELEPHONE SERVICES

Not everyone realizes that you can take care of almost all social security business by telephone including changing your address, applying for benefits, requesting proof of your income, even getting a replacement social security card.

SOCIAL SECURITY CARDS

To replace a lost or stolen social security card you will need to show one or two items of identity, such as: Grady card, state ID card, military service records, insurance papers, medical papers, correspondence with your name on it, W-2's, pay stubs, school records, shelter letters, etc.

HAVE YOU BEEN DENIED DISABILITY BENEFITS?

If your application for disability benefits has been turned down by Social Security, and you think they were wrong to turn you down, you can appeal their denial. Social Security will help you to file this appeal. You should consider getting an attorney. The Ga. Law Center at 404/681-0680 might be able to help you. Jeffrey Flynn is an attorney who handles lots of cases. He doesn't charge you unless you win. His number is 404/876-4600.

DO YOU GET SOCIAL SECURITY BUT DO NOT GET SSI?

If you get SSI checks, do not continue reading. If you do not get SSI, but you do get Social Security disability or retirement checks and the amount of your check is less than \$672 and you have no more than \$4,000 in resources, you might be eligible for QMB benefits. This means that if Medicare Part B premiums are being deducted from your checks, the state of Georgia will pay this premium for you each month saving you, more than \$45 a month through a program called QMB (Qualified Medicare Beneficiary).
